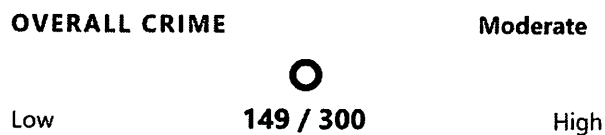

Is 76006 a Safe Zip Code?

Yes — this zip code has good safety. Zip code 76006 in Arlington, TX has a safety grade of **B**. The overall crime index is 149, which is **49% above** the national average of 100. This zip code is safer than **15%** of zip codes in Arlington.

Compared to the Arlington average (crime index 62), zip code 76006 is **87% higher** in overall crime. Residents and visitors should exercise extra caution in this area, particularly after dark.

Looking at specific crime types, **larceny / theft** is the most elevated concern (index: 174, 74% above average), while **rape** is the lowest risk (index: 92). Property crime is more prevalent than violent crime here, consistent with broader national patterns.

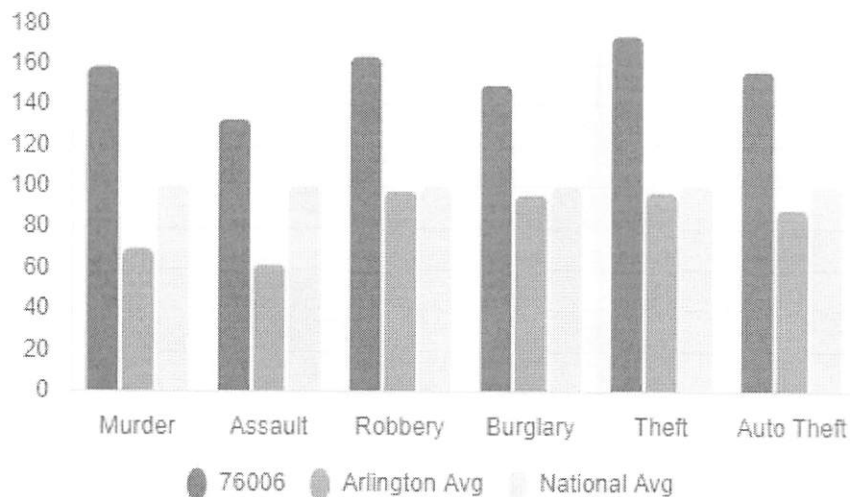

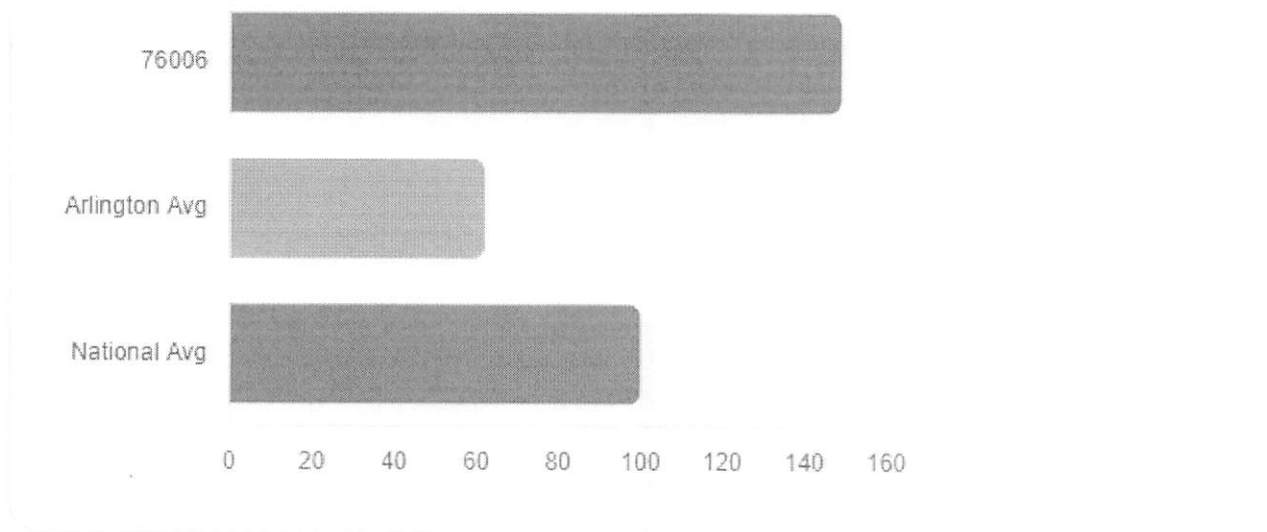
Crime index by category: 76006 vs Arlington average vs national average.

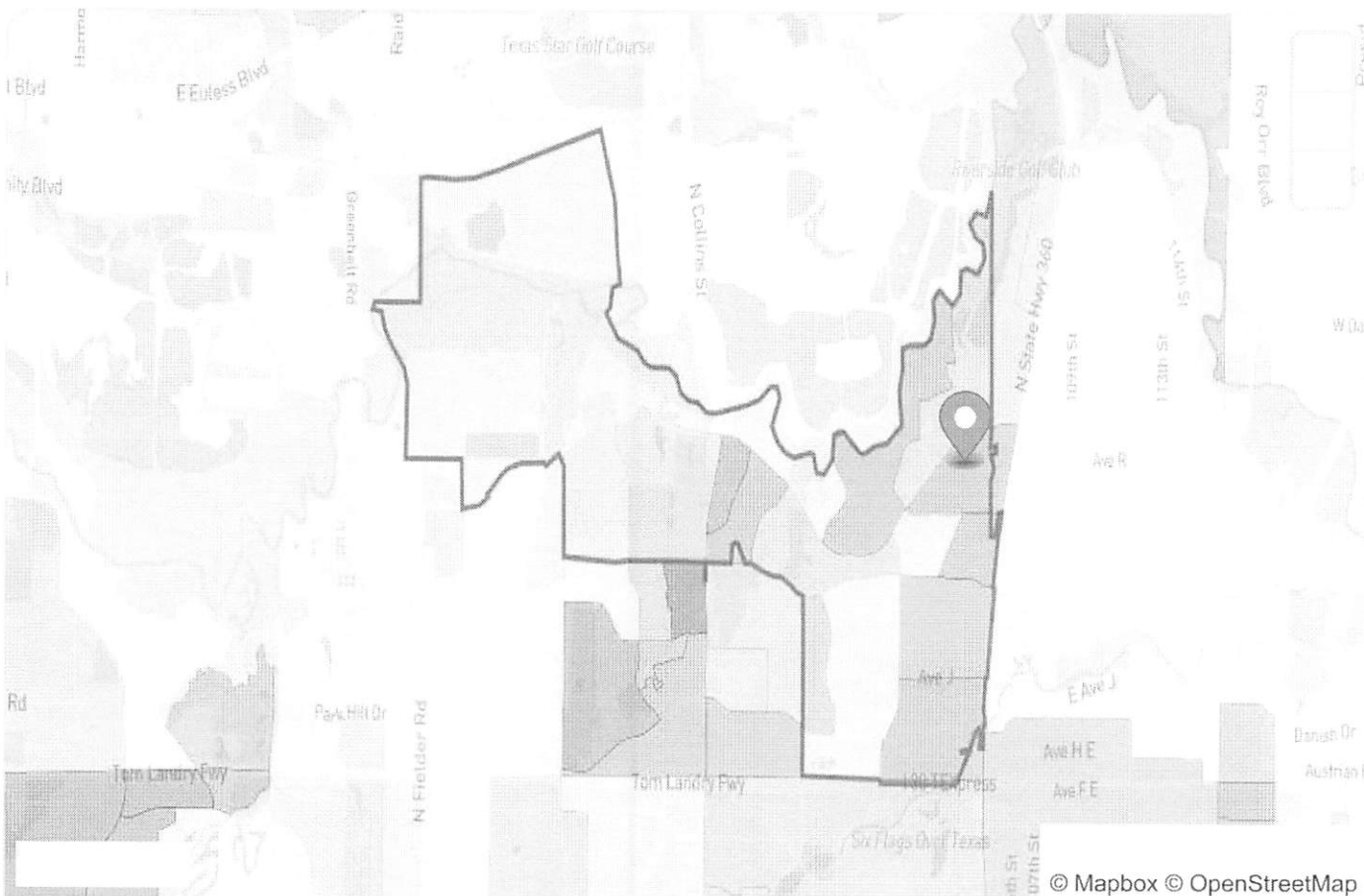

ARLINGTON CAREER INSTITUTE EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS PLAN/CAMPUS SECURITY REPORT

A copy of this plan is given to all faculty and staff during their first week of initial employment. This plan is also available on the school's website at www.arlingtoncareerinstitute.edu.

What is an emergency? An emergency is a sudden, unexpected, or possibly dangerous situation that requires immediate action. The response to any situation depends on the impact it may have on the students, staff, and facilities involved. Please understand the safety and security of all ACI students, faculty and staff are top priorities. All staff members receive training in emergency response, communication, drills, and evacuations.

In the event of an emergency, general instructions include but are not limited to:

- Call 911 (police and fire)
- Perform CPR, if trained, or use AED located across from the student breakroom.
- If it becomes necessary to evacuate the building, after receiving communication from school personnel, all individuals shall proceed to the nearest exit or meet in the computer lab if instructed to do so.
- Lock down campus and classrooms when there may be an immediate threat near or on the school campus. Students are to remain in their classrooms away from doors and windows. All interior doors will be locked.

Shelter in place is initiated when students and staff need to be inside for safety and for protection from dangers outside the building such as weather, fire, or police presence. Students and staff are to remain in classrooms or the computer lab until the situation is resolved.

Communication is done through text messaging from the highest ranking official on campus during the emergency or by email to all students, faculty, and staff, and by notifying the appropriate authorities.

Faculty, staff, and students can report information regarding danger, criminal activity, threats, etc. to the school's main number (972) 647-1607 or to the campus director's email jvecchio@arlingtoncareerinstitute.edu.

Drills for students, faculty, and staff are reviewed and practiced on a semiannual basis. A fire drill was conducted for the entire building on December 13, 2024, at 10:00 a.m.

PROCEDURES FOR REPORTING CRIMES:

- Call 911 (police and fire)
- Notify on-sight security guard. Security office located on ground floor of the building.

DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURES:

Disciplinary actions of both employees and students are to be directed to the campus director or the assistant director.

ACTIVE SHOOTER/INTRUDER RESPONSE GUIDE:

An active shooter is an individual, or multiple individuals, actively engaged in killing or attempting to kill people in a confined space or highly populated area. In most cases, active shooters use firearms and choose their victims at random with the objective of killing as many people as possible. Active shooter situations can change quickly and unfold rapidly. In order to stop a shooter and minimize harm to our staff, faculty, and students, an immediate response by those individuals and deployment of law enforcement resources is critical. The same precautions taken for an active shooter should be taken for any intruder.

ACTIVE SHOOTER RESPONSE GUIDE

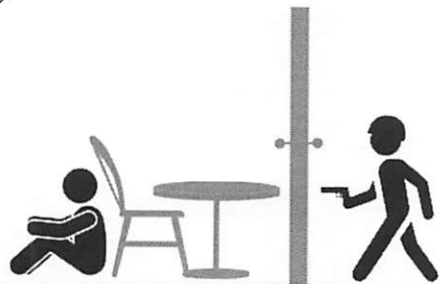
RUN (If you can)

- Get out if you can, even if others insist on staying
- Leave belongings behind
- Your life is more precious than "things"
- Once out, call 9-1-1



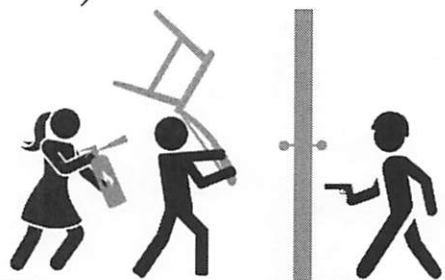
HIDE (If you need)

- If you can't get out, find a place to hide
- Barricade or lock doors
- Hide behind large objects
- Turn out lights and silence your phone



FIGHT (If you must)

- Attempt to incapacitate the shooter
- Act with aggression
- Improvise weapons
- Commit to your actions



In the instance of an active shooter/intruder, every second counts. So remember these three key steps: **RUN, HIDE, and FIGHT.**

RUN:

If you determine that you can *reach an escape path* to a safer area, then *get out*.

1. Be aware of your surroundings.
2. Have an exit plan.
3. Move away from the threat as quickly as possible.
4. Create as much distance between you and the threat as possible.

HIDE:

If you can't evacuate, find a secure place to hide out.

1. Create distance between you and the threat.
2. Find barriers to prevent or slow down the shooter from getting to you.
3. Turn off the lights and silence your phones.
4. Remain out of sight by hiding behind large objects.
5. Be quiet.

FIGHT:

As a last resort, if you can't hide out and if you have absolutely no other option, confront the active shooter.

1. Be aggressive, yell, and commit to your actions.
2. Do not fight fairly. Throw items and use improvised weapons.
3. Survive by any means necessary.

SEVERE THUNDERSTORM/TORNADO SAFETY BASICS:

1. Get In:

- Put as many walls between you and the outside as possible.
- Stay away from doors and windows.

2. Get Down:

- Get to the lowest floor possible. The computer lab is the safest area in the building.

3. Cover Up

4. Remain Calm

TYPES OF SEVERE WEATHER:

Tornado: A violently rotating column of air extending from a thunderstorm cloud to the ground. The National Weather Scale is used to categorize tornadoes.

Severe Thunderstorm: A thunderstorm that produces a tornado, damaging winds of 58 mph or higher, and/or quarter size (1 inch) hail or larger.

Flash Flood: A flood which will create an immediate threat to life or property.

High Wind: A high wind warning is issued for sustained winds of 40 mph or wind gusts of 58 mph.
